**Hearing and Seeing What God is Saying and Doing —50-Day Scripture/Prayer Calendar  
For Now. Today... and Forever. Living in and Looking Forward to All Jesus Paid for and All He Promises!**

This *Daily Walk and Prayer Calendar* looks at the promises of God in the midst of the pleasures and perils of life. How He works His will matters each day. He is continually working, changing each child of His, arranging each day, rearranging each body of believers so that they mature—looking, acting, speaking, seeing, more and more like Jesus. It’s all so we *see* and *hear* Him more clearly. What is God doing today? In your life? The circumstances differ for each of us, but God remains the same. So, *See 20/20*—look up, listen up, discover and *see* what God is saying and doing... and *Pray!*

All should bow as “<i>angels and authorities and powers</i>” should bow. He is the Risen Lord enthroned. Peter wrote about “<i>the glory that is to be revealed</i>.” What we face today is not all there is; when Christ returns, He will come in His glory. <p>Day43<b>Looking at Him 25</b> 1 Peter 5:2-4. Shepherd the people of God, caring for them as tender sheep. Eagerly look to Him, following His will. Expect rewards, even an “<i>unfading crown of glory</i>” from <b>Him!</b></p>	<p>Day 44 <b>“Clothed...” 26</b> 1 Peter 5:5-6. Like servants to one another, “<i>clothe yourselves with humility toward one another</i>.” God sets up in battle against pride, but gladly blesses humility with His “<i>mighty hand</i>.”</p>	<p>Day 45 <b>He Cares 27</b> 1 Peter 5:7. God keeps on caring. Help others know His care, so no one worries. By His Mighty Hand, God is able to take care of any need. Through the Ages, Scripture records many spiritual battles and how the Lord gave victory after victory. Believers in “<i>Babylon</i>” or Rome or wherever can experience grace, love, and peace “<i>in Christ</i>.” Keep on looking to Jesus Christ, the source and security for each child of God.  <b>Consider setting aside a Special Time for Prayer Today, Day 50!</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>“This is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent” John 17:3 [NASB]</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>“But as for me, I would seek God, and I would place my cause before God; Who does great and unsearchable things, Wonders without number.”—Job 5:8-9 [NASB]</b></p> <p><b>Seeing and Knowing</b> is at the <i>heart</i> of walking with God. Everyone walks about stumbling in darkness, until the Lord opens the eyes to see as He sees. Ephesians 1:18 presents a promise, a spiritual reality, and a prayer, that “<i>the eyes of your heart may be enlightened, so that you will know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the surpassing greatness of His power toward us who believe</i>.” Seeing with eyes of faith means seeing what God is doing. Sometimes that means quitting certain things, leaving behind certain habits, adding other things or habits, dealing with toxic people or situations, or adjusting in some other ways... always to better believe, see, and act. Whatever the case, now is the time to <b>pray!</b></p> <p><b>Take the Time</b> you need—<b>Now!</b> How we use <b>TIME</b> is always crucial in these matters—<b>time in prayer</b> can help us <b>SEE</b> better. We are continually advised of ways to “save time,” “use your time,” “spend some extra time.” Exhortations abound: Look for “spare time”—“Don’t waste time.” God exhorts us in Ephesians 5:15 to “<b>redeem the time</b>,” referring to consciously “buying up” our time day by day, using it wisely, not foolishly, making the most of each moment. One of the best ways to make good use of time is to <b>pray</b>. <b>Prayer</b> is one of the best uses of time—Prayer Time is never wasted time, but potentially invested time. God works in answer to prayer in ways that defy our human logic. He goes beyond our abilities and sensibilities to accomplish what only He could do... <b>when we pray</b>. We may face a battle over <b>time</b> or <b>timing</b>, even delays and detours, but God is at work, even when we cannot see His work.</p>					
<p><b>Remember: God <i>always sees</i> clearly! That means sometimes He acts “two minutes till too late,” but He is never late... or early... Always on time!</b></p> <p><b>See Now as the Time to Pray...</b></p>						
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**Be looking! Some of God's answers to Prayer:**

- 1) Yes, now. I am glad you asked. 2) Yes, but not yet. You or others are not ready. 3) Yes, little by little. Trust Me in this.  
4) Yes, but different (or better) than you think. 5) Yes, but ask for more. 6) No, never. I love you too much.

**FOR YOU PERSONALLY—HOW TO USE THE 50 DAY PRAYER CALENDAR—“SEEING 20/20”—A CALL TO 50 DAYS OF SEEING GOD AND PRAYING**

How are things looking? Are you having “the time of your life” or “tough times”? How is your prayer life? Are you spending “time” in prayer, “time” with God, or is your “time just too stretched”? Remember—God gives us the time we need—each of us has **enough time to do the will of God...** but not enough time to do His will **and** our will, our “add-on” projects, wishes, or plans. We need to **see** things God’s way. That means deleting some things, maybe “good” things, but from God’s perspective they are not “better” or “best.” Look for **God’s Best** things.

Look around—no end of needs or work to do... more work tomorrow, and the next day, and the next. More needs, more requests from others, more, more, more. What should we do? We need to see clearly, see God at work, and pray. Seek the Lord for His Wisdom from Above, to know what is **His Best** for each day. Spend time in His Word and time with Him. **Time with the Lord is invested time, never wasted time; it helps us see better.**

Consider this a **personal** adventure in “**how God can show me His will, enabling me to see His ways better,**” especially in **prayer**. This can be a **family** adventure as well. It can apply to your **job, school, and church**. The Lord has much for us to see His way. In Psalm 25:4, David prayed, “*make me know Your ways, O LORD; teach me Your paths.*” Later, David prayed, “*teach me Your way, O LORD; I will walk in Your truth*” (Psalm 86:11). Moses asked the LORD to let him experientially **know God’s ways** in order to truly know Him (Exodus 33:13). Psalm 103:7 notes that “*the sons of Israel*” knew God’s “*acts,*” but the LORD “*made known His ways to Moses.*” Knowing one’s acts is often equated with knowing *about* someone but knowing one’s **ways** is more related to an *intimate* knowledge. Moses experienced that; as we walk with God, we need to seek Him to better know **His ways**—in prayer, in Scripture, in daily life. Jesus prayed for us to “*know*” Him and the Father (John 17:3). The disciples **prayed** many times and saw God guide them in their days (Acts 1:14, 24).

This **50-Day Prayer Adventure** is designed to give a specific focus **each day** grouped around one of Seven Faith Focus Points—Each day **see** what God says in Scripture and **Pray!** Here are the Seven Points, each focusing on seeing what matters to God ...

1. **See God**—God is Great and Good. He works to fulfill His purposes whether in nations, states, cities, neighborhoods, jobs, schools, churches, families, or **your** personal life.
2. **See Me**—Each person matters to God. It is crucial to see “me” 20/20 as God sees. He knows every heart, every hurt, motive, and need.
3. **See Others**—God shows no partiality to anyone. Helping and caring for others is part of God’s plan for each person, being your “*brother’s keeper.*”
4. **See Scripture**—The Word of God is pure and can be trusted. Scripture reveals God and His amazing wisdom, mercy, holiness, and love.
5. **See Opposition and Opportunity**—We face many needs, challenges, perplexities, and questions. It is always right to pray, not wait until others weigh in with their suggestions, opinions, or ‘answers.’ All kinds of opposition arise in daily life, as do various opportunities. We need to **see** clearly to pray and to respond rightly to any opposition or opportunity.
6. **See Time and Timing**—God’s desires and delights are ultimately completed in doing His **will** in His **Time** and with **His Timing**. God uses **Time** and **Timing** in the lives of people individually as well as in families, churches, communities, and nations.
7. **See Eternity**—Beyond time and beyond full comprehension, God calls us to live in light of eternity, investing in relationships. Relationships and Eternity matter.

**HERE’S HOW DAILY...** Use the Scriptures for each day as your morning **Quiet Time** reading (or other times during the day). The point is **regular intake** of God’s Word and **praying God’s will God’s way**. **Read** each Scripture. Meditate and **Think** it over. **Pray** that Scripture back to the Lord for yourself or for someone else. **Ask** God for wisdom, insight, and clear **application to your** life. **Dot down** your thoughts or a prayer request based on that Scripture. **Focus First** on the Lord and your relationship with Him. God works for His Name’s sake. Pray for those God brings to mind—they need to know God cares and answers prayer.

**For example**, the Prayer Scripture for every Monday focuses on **See Me**. For Monday, Day 9 the **title phrase** is “**New Appetite**” and the Scripture reading is from **1 Peter 2**. When a person comes to faith in Christ, God gives that person a new nature with a new appetite. Just like a newborn baby needs the super nourishment of milk, so God’s children need the super nourishment of the Word of God—God changes us from the inside out and part of that change is through the supernatural work of His Word. Pray, asking the Lord to work in your life through His Word. Ask Him to work in your family, in many families, with church leaders and in the larger **family of God**, as well as in our communities/nation. Ask the Lord for insight and application and pray for **those** He brings to mind. **SEE 20/20... AND PRAY!**

## Ways to Pray...

There are several ways to **PARTICIPATE** in “**SEEING 20/20**”—**50 Days of Praying**. These include Personal Prayer, Family Prayer, Prayer Partner Prayer, Small Group Prayer, Church-wide Prayer, even Community-wide, Region-wide, or Nation-wide prayer.

**The Prayer Partner Option**—You may **also** want to pray together with a Prayer Partner—in the family, at work or school or church. **Set a time** each day to pray—this includes **Cell phone simplicity, Online**, with any **set time** to pray. The point is **praying together**, seeing what **God** could do.

**The Day of Prayer and Fasting Option**—Some will want to spend a day or several days in Prayer with Fasting during these 50 Days. This could include a **Personal Day of Prayer**. Pick one or several of the 50 days or part of day when you can be focused and undistracted.

**The Weekly Small Group Option for Prayer**—In addition to your **Daily Time**, you may want to gather with others **Weekly** for prayer. The need certainly cries out loudly for us to call on the Lord personally and **together** with other believers. This could be with folks in your Sunday School Class/ Connection Group/ Life Group or Small Group, with two or three work associates, with fellow students at school or on the college campus, on the Internet or Phone, any arrangement, anywhere believers can talk and pray.

**An Extended Time of Prayer**—Take a **Day or Part of a Day and Pray** with several in your **Bible Study Group** or other **Small Group** or even as a **Couple or a Family**.

**PrayerEveryWhere**—Consider prayer walking the streets, homes, schools, businesses, and recreation areas around **your church**—or around **your** neighborhood or community. Draw a circle around where you live and begin prayer walking that area during these 50 days.

**Think of What Could *Become* Because of Our *Praying*!**  
**Think of What Has *Come* Because of What *Christ Has Done*!**  
**Think of What Is *Coming* Because of What *Christ Has Promised*!**

## Pray for Spiritual Awakening!

**Know Jesus for Sure!**—Psalm 145:18-19 promises, “*The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth. He will fulfil the desire of those who fear Him; He will also hear their cry and will save them.*” God responds to the *honest, humble* heart-cry—“Lord Jesus, I believe You died on the Cross for my sin and arose from the dead. I admit my sinfulness, turn from my sins, and ask You to forgive my sins. Please cleanse me, change me, come into my life as Lord and Savior, and make me Your child forever. I want to follow You the rest of my life. Thank You for saving me and giving me the gift of eternal life. Daily fill me with Your Spirit, giving me Your love and power. Amen.”—**He saves the one who calls on Him!** (see Luke 18:13-14; John 1:12; 3:16-17; 20:30-31; Acts 4:12; Romans 3:23-26; 5:1-2, 6-10; 6:23; 10:9-13; Galatians 3:8-14; Ephesians 2:8-9; 1 Peter 2:24; 3:18; 1 John 1:5-9) [Scriptures are quoted from the NASB].
